PRESIDENT'S REPORT



Dear ASSTA-ites, I write about two issues, a closing down and an opening up.

- *The ARC Research Network on Human Communication Science (HCSNet)*

ASSTA is one of the three professional organisations that have underpinned, for the last 5 years, the ARC Human Communication Science Research Network (HCSNet), an interdisciplinary forum for research and technology in human communication including, but not limited to, speech. Funding for HCSNet finishes around mid-2010. In its time HCSNet has run 64 Summer School courses, 44 workshops, and

5 Summerfests.

HCSNet has set in place various innovations and acquired a great deal of corporate knowledge, and with HCSNet winding up, it might be a good time to reflect on whether, and if so what ASSTA might learn from these – especially given the significant role that ASSTA members played in HCSNet governance and events. For example, at Summerfest there were speed papers (4-slide, 4-min papers to introduce new ideas or report on new results), skills sessions (in three sections for PhD students, Early Career Researchers, and more established staff), and Summer Schools (similar to the SST tutorials but with a significant number of international presenters). Just as we, ASSTA set a trend by holding the first International Speech Science and Technology conference in the world (Canberra, 1986), might there be a role for ASSTA in setting trends for a new era of local specifically Speech Science and Technology conferences? Given the increased accessibility of International Conferences such as Interspeech, ICPhS, etc., it could well be time to review our International Australasian SST to see how it



might best facilitate research output and the promotion of both the field of Speech Science and Technology in Australia and New Zealand, and the key role of ASSTA in that field. Given the ERA and the diminished role for conference proceedings as research output, is it possible that we might do it smarter; that there may be room for, perhaps, speed papers, skills sessions, collaboration sessions, etc. at SST? I put this on the table for discussion, and welcome your response.

- *ASSTA as an Industry Partner – ARC Linkage Grants*

In news just to hand, a team of ASSTA linguists and speech, computer, and cognitive scientists from around Australia have secured \$650K for an ARC Linkage Infrastructure Equipment and Facilities project to establish the Big ASC, the Big Australian Speech Corpus. This was also supported by pledges of a combined \$435K from 10 Universities and notably ASSTA (a total of \$1.085M). This auditory-visual speech corpus will provide data for various applications in linguistics, speech technology, forensic science, and security and will be a great boon to speech

science research in Australia (and to an extent, New Zealand). The grant will be administered through UWS with significant input from Macquarie, and additional node collection sites at Flinders, UniMelb, UCanberra, UNSW, UQueensland, UniSyd, ANU, UWA, and UTas.

The success of this LIEF heralds a new era for both the ARC and ASSTA. For the ARC, this is the first LIEF grant to my knowledge to award funds not for a large piece or a complex of equipment, but for ‘soft’ piece of infrastructure – one that must be collected, stored, annotated and made available. For ASSTA, this marks the first occasion for which ASSTA has been a successful Industry Partner for a significant grant in Speech Science and Technology. We want to do more of this – use our funds and influence for the good of the field. I urge you to think creatively about how you might tap into this role of ASSTA and we look forward to the opportunity to assist with other research grant applications in Speech Science and Technology.
